

Student Dress Policy

Some basic principles to observe:

- .1 Student dress and appearance must reflect the following:
 - tasteful appearance
 - simplicity and modesty
 - cleanliness and neatness
 - suitability for school activities and for weather
- .2 Student dress should be such that their clothing reflects that they are in a Christian learning environment.
- .3 Students should be dressed in appropriate clothing which is conducive to good study habits and which is modest in appearance.
- .4 Student level of dress for the classroom differs from the kind of dress worn at the beach or in recreation.

Specifically, the following are considered to be unsuitable wearing apparel for school:

- .1 Tops worn which cover the shoulder to a width of less than four fingers. Therefore, spaghetti string tops are not acceptable.
- .2 Short tops so that the mid-riff and belly button shows.
- .3 Halter tops.
- .4 Short shorts. Please note that walking shorts may be worn; they may be no shorter than the tip of the outstretched hand when standing.
- .5 Clothing that refers to rock groups, or alcohol, or promotes unacceptable life styles.
- .6 Grubby jeans or cut-offs.
- .7 Pants/shorts worn with the crotch almost at the knees and/or the top part of boxer shorts above the belt loops.
- .8 Caps and/or bandanas worn inside the school. (These may be worn outside, but must be taken off when entering the school).
- .9 Piercing of body parts other than the ears.
